SATs results 2023

6 children took the SATs test which was internally marked

Out of the 6 children, 5 children that were entered for the SATs had no key stage 1 education from Oaktree. They started in either Year 3 or 4. 2 children received key stage 1 education at Oaktree and 3 children received Year 2 education. 1 child was not entered due to travelling.

A pupil's scaled score is based on their raw scores. The raw score is the total number of marks a pupil scores in a test, based on the number of questions they answered correctly. The raw score is converted into a scaled score to ensure an accurate comparison of pupil performance over time.

A scaled score of 100 will always represent the expected standard on the test. Pupils scoring 100 or more will have met the expected standard on the test. Pupils who achieve a scaled score of 110 or above will have achieved the higher standard (Greater depth)

Further analysis

77% of the children achieved the expected standard in Reading. This indicates that reading is a medium subject in Year 6.

Boys achieved better than girls in all subjects but there were more boys who were entered for the SATs than girls. Therefore, there is no trend identified in the results.

In the SPAG test, 92% of the pupils met the expected standard. This indicates that SPAG is a strong subject in Year 6. Just one child (a girl) who did not make the standard

In Maths 77% of the children met the expected standard. This indicates that Maths is a medium subject in Year 6. On further analysis of the Maths papers, the results showed that there was varied results across the different papers of arithmetic and reasoning. Thus more practise with reasoning and problem solving as well as arithmetic will be planned in for next year to be covered in recovery lessons and warm up lessons.

SATs Results

We are delighted with our End of Key Stage scores. The following table compares our scores to the national picture and as you can see, we are above the national results in all areas.

- The average scaled score for Reading at Oak Tree is 4% higher from the national score.
- The average scaled score for SPAG at Oak Tree is 20% higher from the national score.
- The average scaled score for Maths at Oak Tree is 6% higher from the national score.

Attainment in writing teacher assessment

In writing TA, the proportion of pupils who reached the expected standard in 2023 is 87%. Out of that 83%, 13% (2 children) reached Greater depth. Two children (13%) did not achieve the standard.

Changes made within the 2017/18 writing TA frameworks mean judgements are not directly comparable to those made using the previous interim frameworks in 2016 and 2017.

To reach the expected standard in writing TA, a pupil must achieve an outcome of 'reaching the expected standard' or 'working at greater depth'.
